

Senate 2019-20 – 1R Resolution in Support of AB-331

WHEREAS, Associated Students, Incorporated (ASI) of California State University, East Bay (CSUEB) is the recognized voice of approximately 16,000 students; and

WHEREAS, it is the mission of the ASI Board of Directors to advocate and provide responsible and effective leadership for a diverse student population in order to make sound decisions for the betterment of CSUEB students; and

WHEREAS, California has one of the largest and most diverse student populations in the nation, where ethnic minorities account for over 71% of the student population, with more than 90 languages spoken in local district schools¹; and

WHEREAS, according to U.S. News & World Report, California State University, East Bay received one of the highest diversity scores of any university in the United States²; and

WHEREAS, AB-331 would add the completion of a one-semester course in ethnic studies based on the model curriculum in ethnic studies developed by the Instructional Quality Commission, to the high school graduation requirements commencing with the 2024–25 school year³; and

WHEREAS, High school students currently studying in California are required to complete the following in order to graduate:

- Three years of English
- Two years of mathematics (including Algebra I)

- Three years of social science (including U.S. history and geography; world history, culture, and geography; one semester of American government; and one semester of economics)
- Two years of science (including biology and physical science)
- Two years of physical education
- One year of foreign language or visual and performing arts or commencing with the 2012–13 school year, career technical education. For the purpose of satisfying the minimum course requirement, a course in American Sign Language shall be deemed a course in foreign language⁴; and

WHEREAS, a 2016 study conducted by Stanford University found that in several high schools in the San Francisco Unified School District, a year-long 9th grade ethnic studies course was linked to an increase of attendance by 21%, GPA by 1.4 grade points, and credits earned by 23⁵; and

WHEREAS, ethnic studies help students develop an academic identity and build empathy cross-culturally and allows for communities that may be different from one another to grow closer together⁶; and

WHEREAS, students improve academically if their identity is reflected in the curriculum, students understand how to deconstruct self-created ideas of unworthiness, and students feel more empowered when taking ethnic studies courses⁷; and

RESOLVED, that copies of this resolution be distributed to the Office of the President, Office of the Vice President for Student Affairs, Office of the Provost and Vice President of Academic Affairs, the University Academic Senate, Office of Academic Affairs, The Pioneer, East Bay Today, the California State Student Association, California State Legislators, and any other relevant parties.
