

## **BOD 2021-2022 - 9R**

Resolution in Support of The Pupil Health: School Employee and Pupil Training: Excused Absences: Youth Mental and Behavioral Health Bill

**WHEREAS**, Associated Students, Incorporated (ASI) of California State University, East Bay (CSUEB) is the recognized voice of approximately 16,000 students; and

**WHEREAS**, it is the mission of the ASI Board of Directors to advocate and provide responsible and effective leadership for a diverse student population in order to make sound decisions for the betterment of CSUEB students; and

**WHEREAS,** The CSUEB ASI Policy Agenda for 2021-2022 states that "The Director of Wellness and Director of Programming Council will work closely together to ensure that mental health resources and programming are available to students and hold that basic needs, such as food, financial, and housing security, will be a priority." and

WHEREAS, "Existing law, notwithstanding the requirement that each person between 6 and 18 years of age who is not otherwise exempted is subject to compulsory full-time education, requires a pupil to be excused from school for specified types of absences, including, among others, if the absence was due to the pupil's illness." <sup>2</sup> and

**WHEREAS,** "This bill would include, within the meaning of an absence due to a pupil's illness, an absence for the benefit of the pupil's mental or behavioral health." and

**WHEREAS**, "Existing law requires the governing board of a school district to give diligent care to the health and physical development of pupils and authorizes the governing board of a school district to employ properly certified persons for the work. Existing law requires a school of a
